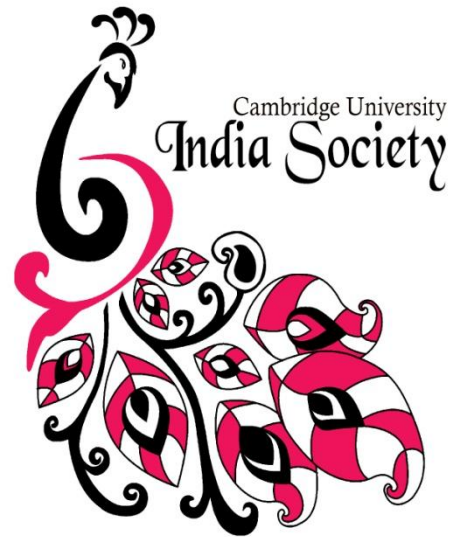

Respected Sir,

The Cambridge University India Society would like to voice the deep concern of the Indian students studying at the University of Cambridge regarding the growing levels of corruption in India and the seemingly ineffective way in which it is presently being dealt with. We would like to express that we stand in full solidarity and support of the peaceful campaign the people of India are now engaged in demanding urgent redressal of the presently deficient anti-corruption systems.

We would like to submit that we are completely supportive of the participation of members of civil society in the process to finalise the Lokpal Bill. We believe that this participative process is the most effective way forward to put in place anti-corruption systems that would exercise an operative check on all sections of Indian democracy – the governed and the governing alike.

We sincerely appreciate your Government's effort to start a constructive dialogue with representative members of the civil society with regards drafting of the Lokpal Bill. We urge the Government to accelerate this process and set up a joint committee consisting of members of civil society and members of the Government and entrust it with the responsibility of drawing up the final draft of the Lokpal Bill. We are also hopeful that the Lokpal Bill thus finalised be legislated into law without any undue delay.

We have sincere trust in your personal commitment to integrity and earnestly hope you will take immediate assertive measures and lead from the front to rid the country of this serious shortcoming in its untarnished adherence to democratic practices.
